March 18, 1766: Stamp Act Repealed  
 Vocabulary

<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Enormous	Adjective	unusually large or great in size, amount, or degree
Revolution	Noun	the overthrow of a ruler or political system; a dramatic change in ideas or practice
Frontier	Noun	a border between two countries, or the land immediately adjacent to this; the part of a country with expanding settlement that is being opened up by hunters, herders, and other pioneers in advance of full urban settlement
King's Ransom	Noun	a large amount of money. The fictional amount of money it would take to rescue a kidnapped king
Parliament	Noun	the supreme legislative body in various countries. In the United Kingdom, Parliament consists of the House of Commons and the House of Lords.
Colonists	Noun	an immigrant to a new colony, or one of the founders of it
Transactions	Noun	an instance of doing business of some kind; the act of negotiating something or carrying out a business deal
Erupted	Verb	burst out suddenly or violently; suddenly erupted into shouting
Dreaded	Adjective	inspiring great fear
Disdain	Noun	extreme contempt or disgust for something or somebody
Asserted	Verb	to state something as being true; exercise your power, influence, and prerogatives in an obvious way
