<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Trustees	Noun	A group of people who are responsible for governing a territory
Fair Trade	Noun	Trade in which fair prices are paid to everyone for their goods
Negotiator	Noun	A person in charge of causing two parties to come to an agreement through discussion and compromise
Diplomat	Noun	a member or employee of a government who represents his or her country in dealings with other nations, especially by working in an embassy or consulate abroad
Assure	Verb	To convince somebody of something. To overcome somebody's doubt or disbelief about something
Welfare	Noun	somebody's state or condition with respect to whether he or she is healthy, safe, happy, or prospering
Posing	Verb	to strike a certain posture and facial expression for a photograph or painting
Smallpox	Noun	a highly contagious disease caused by a poxvirus and marked by high fever and the formation of scar-producing pustules. A worldwide inoculation program has almost eradicated the smallpox virus from the human population.
Tangible	Adjective	able to be touched or perceived through the sense of touch
Relic	Noun	something that has survived from a long time ago, often a part of something old that has remained when the rest of it has decayed or been destroyed
