<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Preachers	Noun	A minister, somebody whose occupation so to give sermons, preach the gospel, or conduct religious services
Methodist	Noun	a movement of Protestant Christianity represented by a number of denominations and organizations, claiming a total of approximately seventy million adherents worldwide. The movement traces its roots to John Wesley's evangelistic revival movement within Anglicanism
Missionary	Noun	somebody sent to another country by a church to spread its faith or to do social and medical work
Georgia Trustee	Noun	Members of the board of trustees who were put in charge of governing the Georgia colony
Appointed	Verb	To give someone a position or job to do
Passion	Noun	intense or overpowering emotion such as love, joy, hatred, or anger
Fervor	Noun	Intensity, extremely passionate enthusiasm
Unorthodox	Adjective	Unconventional, not the typical style or manner of doing things
Igniting	Verb	To start a cause like lighting a fire
Evangelical	Adjective	relating or belonging to any Protestant Christian church that emphasizes the authority of the Bible and salvation through the personal acceptance of Jesus Christ
Revival	Noun	A renewal of interest in religion
