| <u>Word</u>        | <u>Part of Speech</u> | <u>Definition</u>   |
|--------------------|-----------------------|---|
| Golden age         | Noun                  | a period of great prosperity or achievement, especially in the arts   |
| Broadway           | Noun                  | a long avenue in Manhattan, New York City, part of which is the main area of the city's theater district  |
| Character Actor    | Noun                  | an actor who specializes in playing the roles of unusual or distinctive characters  |
| Nominated          | Verb                  | to suggest somebody for an honor or award   |
| Portraying         | Verb                  | to play a character in drama  |
| Overbearing        | Adjective             | Bossy, arrogant and tending to order people around  |
| Gentlemen          | Noun                  | a polite and cultured man who behaves with courtesy and thoughtfulness  |
| Trademark          | Noun                  | a distinctive characteristic associated with a person or group of people  |
| Monocle            | Noun                  | an eyeglass for correcting the vision of one eye, held in position by the muscles around the eye socket   |
| Classical Training | Adjective             | A type of training that involves studying Shakespeare, Greco-Roman playwrights, Moliere, Chekhov and traditional acting methods like the Stanislavski's system, and the Alexander technique |
| Comedic            | Adjective             | entertainment that is amusing or humorous   |
