<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Flip-flopping	Verb	to have a change of opinion, especially when this leads to a change of policy
Staunch	Adjective	Showing loyalty, or enthusiasm
Nullification	Noun	the refusal by a state government to allow application of a section of federal law
Secessionist	Noun	In American History this is a person who supported the policy of the Southern States withdrawing from the Union to form the Confederacy
Full-fledged	Adjective	Completely developed
Abolitionist	Noun	Opponent of slavery, an antislavery campaigner in the 18th and 19th centuries
Fanatics	Noun	Extremist, someone who holds extreme or irrational enthusiasm or beliefs
Subjugating	Verb	to bring somebody, especially a people or nation, under the control of another, e.g. by military conquest
Moderates	Adjective	Middle-of-the road, not extreme or radical.
Outmaneuvered	Verb	To overcome (an opponent) by artful, clever maneuvering.
Averted	Verb	Stopped something from happening
Uncompromising	Adjective	No giving in. not willing to compromise
