| Word         | Part of Speech | <u>Definition</u>   |
|--------------|----------------|---|
| Strict       | Adjective      | severe in maintaining discipline, or rigorous in ensuring that rules are obeyed   |
| Ordained     | Verb           | to appoint somebody officially as a priest, minister, or rabbi  |
| Anglican     | Noun           | Protestant denomination. Official Church of England in the 18 <sup>th</sup> century   |
| Methodical   | Adjective      | Systematic, painstaking   |
| Missionaries | Noun           | Somebody sent to another country by a church to spread tis faith or to do social and medical work   |
| Propagation  | Verb           | to spread an idea or custom to many people  |
| Rector       | Noun           | a member of the Anglican clergy who is in charge of a parish  |
| Magistrate   | Noun           | a judge in a lower court whose jurisdiction is limited to the trial of misdemeanors and the conduct of preliminary hearings on more serious charges |
| Reputation   | Noun           | the views that are generally held about somebody or something, a high opinion that people hold about somebody or something                          |
| Denomination | Noun           | a religious grouping within a faith that has its own system of organization   |
