| <u>Word</u> | <u>Part of Speech</u> | <u>Definition</u> |
|-----------------|-----------------------|---|
| Morale | Noun | the general level of confidence or optimism felt by a person or group of people, especially as it affects discipline and motivation |
| Boost | Noun | to help somebody or something to get up or over something by giving a push |
| Carnage | Noun | a large amount of casualties; serious injury to a great many people, e.g. in a major accident |
| Suicidal | Adjective | Extremely dangerous. Acting like they intend or wish to commit suicide |
| Frontal Assault | Noun | To attack from the front. Take the enemy head on. |
| Repulsed | Verb | to repel an attacking military force |
| Casualties | Noun | a member of the armed forces who is killed or injured during combat |
