<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Mildly	Adjective	Gently, not harsh, severe or strong
Champion	Noun	a defender, supporter, or promoter of somebody or something
Boasted	Verb	To talk about your accomplishments without being modest.
Resisted	Verb	Went against, questioned
Authority	Adjective	the right or power to enforce rules or give orders
Regents	Noun	A university official, an officer of a university, especially a member of a governing board
Integration	Noun	the process of opening a group, community, place, or organization to all, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, or social class
Accreditation	Noun	Official recognition that a group or organization has met all the guidelines needed to be official.
Dictator	Noun	a leader who rules a country with absolute power, usually by force
Fierce	Adjective	Aggressive, intense
Segregationist	Noun	Someone who wants to keep the population separated in this case by color of skin.
Appealed	Verb	the power to attract, please, stimulate, or interest by using people's preferences.
Bigotry	Noun	Intolerance
