| <u>Word</u> | Part of Speech | <u>Definition</u> |

| Quaker | Noun | a member of the Society of Friends, a Christian denomination founded in England in the 17th century that rejects formal sacraments, ministry, and creed, and is committed to non-violence. At meetings members are encouraged to speak when they feel moved to do so. |
| Nonviolent | Noun | the principle of refraining from using violence, especially as a means of protest |
| Protests | Noun | to express strong opposition to or disapproval of something in the form of a public demonstration or other action |
| Integrate | Verb | to make a group, community, place, or organization and its opportunities available to everyone, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, or social class |
| Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee | Noun | The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, or SNCC (pronounced "snick") was one of the key organizations in the American civil rights movement of the 1960s. In Georgia SNCC concentrated its efforts in Albany and Atlanta. |
| Voter Drives | Noun | An event or program focused on getting individuals registered to vote |
| Opposition | Noun | a disapproving attitude toward something and a wish to prevent it, or action taken to show disapproval of and prevent something |
| Re-elected | Verb | To be chosen again to hold public office |
| Banned | Verb | Forbidden. To stop somebody from doing something. |
| Unconstitutional | Adjective | Goes against the constitution which is the supreme law of the land. |
