| <u>Word</u> | Part of Speech | <u>Definition</u> |

| Loyalist | Noun | American who supported the British during the American Revolution |
| Backcountry | Noun | Rural area outside the city. Largely unpopulated area far away from city life |
| Royal Banner | Noun | a long piece of cloth, with the symbol of the British Empire |
| Patriot | Noun | In this case a supporter of the American Revolution. Also, a proud supporter or defender of his or her country and its way of life. |
| Militiamen | Noun | Members who serve in a civilian army (militia) |
| Morale | Noun | the general level of confidence or optimism felt by a person or group of people, especially as it affects discipline and motivation |
| Recruitment | Verb | to enlist somebody in a military force, or take part in enlisting people for a military force |
