<u>Word</u>	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Native	Adjective	Coming from a geographic place. The place where you were born
Golden Age	Noun	a period of great prosperity or achievement, especially in the arts
Popularity	Noun	Fact of being well liked and admired by people in general or by a group of people
Pantheon	Noun	a group of people who are the most famous or respected in their field comes from the greek pantheon which was a circular temple in Rome that was completed in 27 bc and dedicated to all the deities but which has been used as a Christian church since ad 609
Imagination	Noun	Creative part of mind, the part of the mind where ideas, thoughts, and images are formed
Resume	Noun	Formal document listing your past experience and achievements. Usually used to apply for jobs
Idol	Noun	somebody or something greatly admired or loved, often to excess
Undisputed	Adjective	Something that is not questioned or opposed. In sports it is a title or record that no one has come close to beating
Heavyweight Title	Noun	Championship in professional boxing for the heaviest weight category, for competitors whose weight does not exceed 79.5 kg/175 lb
Retained	Verb	To keep something
