<u>Word</u>	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Famed	Adjective	Famous, well-known
Buffalo Soldier	Noun	an African American soldier in the U.S. Army during the period between the Civil War and World War I
Calvary Regiment	Noun	A military unit consisting of two or three groups of trips divided into smaller companies. Calvary regiments are on horseback.
Accused	Noun	somebody being charged with wrongdoing in a criminal case
Embezzlement	Verb	to take for personal use money or property that has been given on trust by others, without their knowledge or permission
Acquitted	Verb	to declare officially that somebody is not guilty of a charge
Court Martial	Noun	a military court that tries members of the military and others for offenses under military law
Convicted	Verb	to declare somebody guilty of a crime in a court of law
Conduct Unbecoming an Officer	Noun	In full, "Conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman"; acts punishable under the <u>Uniform Code of Military Justice</u> which, while not necessarily criminal in nature, nevertheless reflect poorly on the government, the military service, and the officer corps. For example, excessive use of profanity or engaging in a drunken brawl might be considered "conduct unbecoming."
Insisting	Verb	to state or demand something firmly in spite of disagreement or resistance from others







Racism	Noun	prejudice or animosity against people who belong to other races
Honorable Discharge	Noun	an official separation from the armed forces, signifying that all duties have been honorably fulfilled
Pardon	Verb	to officially release from any, or any further, punishment somebody who has committed a crime or wrongdoing
