| Word | Part of Speech | <u>Definition</u> |

| Moderate | Adjective | Middle of the road, not leaning extremely to one side or the other |
| Subtle | Adjective | Not obvious |
| Crony | Noun | A close friend of long standing |
| Liberals | Adjectives | relating to a political ideology of liberalism |
| Chastised | Verb | To punish or scold somebody |
| Segregationist | Noun | an advocate or enforcer of keeping races separated, especially racial segregation |
| Racism | Noun | prejudice or animosity against people who belong to other races. Belief in racial superiority |
| Ambitious | Adjective | having a strong desire or need to be successful in life |
| Reform | Verb | the reorganization and improvement of something such as a political institution or system that is considered to be faulty, ineffective, or unjust |
| Agenda | Noun | A elected officials plan or list of things to accomplish while they are in office |
| Appointed | Verb | to select a person or a group of people for an official position or to do a job |
| Predecessors | Noun | somebody who held a position or job before somebody else |
