<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Bigotry	Noun	Prejudice, racism, intolerance. Showing strong opinions in this case about ethnicity
Social Order	Noun	The way a society is organized with some lower
Segregated	Adjective	Separated by race or ethnic status
Halting	Adjective	Having lots of stops or pauses. Hesitant, awkward
Massive Resistance	Noun	a policy declared by U.S. Senator Harry F. Byrd, Sr. on February 24, 1956, to unite other white politicians and leaders in Virginia in a campaign of new state laws and policies to prevent public school desegregation after the Brown v. Board of Education Supreme Court decision in 1954
Stymied	Verb	To stop somebody or something from making progress
Accommodations	Noun	Seating in a vehicle or public facility
Propelled	Verb	To push somebody or something forward
Reconstruction	Noun	the period of U.S. history from 1865 through 1877, during which the states that had seceded during the Civil War were reorganized under federal control and later restored to the Union
Bi-partisan	Adjective	Involving two political parties
