<u>Word</u>	<u>Part of Speech</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Émigré	Noun	A French term for a person who migrated out of the country for political reasons during the French Revolution
Diplomat	Noun	a member or employee of a government who represents his or her country in dealings with other nations, especially by working in an embassy or consulate abroad
Appointed	Verb	Selected for an official position or job
Topographical Engineers	Noun	authorized on 4 July 1838, consisted only of officers and was used for mapping and the design and construction of federal civil works such as lighthouses and other coastal fortifications and navigational routes.
Surveyed	Verb	to make a detailed map of an area of land, including its boundaries, area, and elevation, using geometry and trigonometry to measure angles and distances
Pathfinder	Noun	a discoverer of a route, especially through unmapped territories or uncharted areas of knowledge
Opposition	Noun	a disapproving attitude toward something and a wish to prevent it, or action taken to show disapproval of and prevent something
Fledgling	Adjective	Young and inexperienced – new
