

August 6, 1887: Woolfolk Murders Vocabulary

Word	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Mass Murder	Noun	The act of murdering a large number of people (four or more) typically at the same time.
Slaughtered	Verb	The brutal killing of a person or large numbers of people
Suspicion	Noun	A belief or feeling that something is wrong without specific evidence to support it
Evidence	Noun	The objects or information used to prove or suggest the guilt of somebody accused of a crime
Agitated	Adjective	Anxious, nervous, disturbed
Lynching	Noun	Putting someone to death without a trial. Usually by hanging
Appeals	Noun	the hearing by a superior court of part or the whole of a previously tried case, a request for such a hearing, or the right to have such a hearing
Convicted	Verb	Declared guilty of a crime
