

## August 11, 1938: FDR Gives Controversial Speech in Barnesville Vocabulary

Word	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Campaigned	Verb	To serve or go on a campaign—the competition by rival political candidates and organizations for public office.
New Deal	Noun	The policies of social and economic reform introduced in the United States in the 1930s under the presidency of Franklin D. Roosevelt.
Primary	Noun	an election in which members of a party choose candidates for a governmental position
Critic	Noun	somebody who judges or appraises somebody or something
Miscalculated	Verb	to judge or evaluate somebody or something incorrectly, or form false expectations as to the consequences of an action
Resented	Verb	to feel or show displeasure or to be annoyed
