<u>Word</u>	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Pulitzer Prize	Noun	A prize awarded annually for excellence in American journalism, literature, or music
Acclaimed	Verb	To enthusiastically approve
Southern Renaissance	Noun	The reinvigoration of American Southern literature that began in the 1920s and 1930s with the appearance of writers such as William Faulkner, Caroline Gordon, Elizabeth Madox Roberts, Katherine Anne Porter, Allen Tate, Tennessee Williams, and Robert Penn Warren, among others.
Authenticity	Noun	The genuineness or truth of something
Dialect	Noun	A regional variety of a language, with differences in vocabulary, grammar, and pronunciation
Precursor	Noun	Somebody or something that comes before, and is often considered to lead to the development of, another person or thing
Seclusion	Noun	The state of being in solitude; secluded.
Adversity	Noun	an unfortunate event or circumstance; a condition of misfortune
