Glossary

Antidiscrimination: adjective; opposed to treating or making distinction. in favor or against, a person or thing based on the group or class to which that person or thing belongs rather than on individual merit.

Bigotry: noun; stubborn and complete intolerance of any creed, belief, or opinion that differs from one's own.

Commerce: an interchange of goods or commodities, especially on a large scale between different countries or between different parts of the same country.

Dismantled: verb; to disassemble or pull down; take apart.

Enforcing: verb; to put or keep in force; compel obedience to; urge.

Infringement: noun; a breach or infraction, as of a law, right, or obligation.

Outlawed: verb; to make unlawful or illegal; to prohibit.

Overzealous: adjective; extremely eager, diligent, or devoted.

Patrons: noun; a people who are customers, clients, or paying guests.

Provision: noun; a clause in a law providing for a particular matter; stipulation.

Segregationist: noun; one who favors, encourages, or supports the practice and policy of separate facilities for various ethnic groups within the same society.

Staunch: adjective: firm or steadfast; strong or loyal.

Touted: verb; to describe or advertise boastfully; publicize or promote; praise highly.

Unanimous: adjective; showing complete agreement.
