Glossary

Objective: noun; a goal or purpose

Desegregation: verb; to put an end to a customary or enforced separation of ethnic or racial groups in a place or institution, e.g. in a workplace or school

Formidable: adjective; difficult to deal with or overcome

Coalition: noun; a temporary union between two or more groups

Mobilized: verb; to organize people or resources in order to be ready for action or in order to take action

Tactics: noun; a method used or a course of action followed in order to achieve an immediate or short-term goal

Brutality: noun; being cruel, harsh or ruthless

Demonstrator: noun; supporter or protester, a public protester or supporter of something usually a member of a group.

Parceling: verb; grouping together people or things

Registration: noun; act of signing up for something. In this case to vote.

Statutes : noun; a law established by a legislative body. In this case city government.
