Glossary

Outspoken: adjective; uttered or expressed with frankness or without reserve

Opponent: noun; adversary, rival, enemy

Slaveholder: noun; someone who owns slaves

Namesake: noun; somebody or something with the same name as somebody or something else

Distress: noun; mental suffering, e.g. that caused by grief, anxiety, or unhappiness

Deepened: verb; to become deep or deeper, or make something deep or deeper

Sensation: noun; a state of avid public interest in a phenomenon

Graphic: adjective; very realistic; including a number of vivid descriptive details, especially exciting or unpleasant ones. A violent video game may be described as graphic

Horrors: noun; something that causes a very strong feeling of fear, shock, or disgust

Dissolved: verb; to break apart. In this case to break apart a marriage and a nation

Abolition: ending of slavery, the official ending of the practice of slavery
