Word	Part of Speech	<u>Definition</u>
Morale	Noun	the general level of confidence or optimism felt by a person or group of people, especially as it affects discipline and motivation
Boost	Noun	to help somebody or something to get up or over something by giving a push
Carnage	Noun	a large amount of casualties; serious injury to a great many people, e.g. in a major accident
Suicidal	Adjective	Extremely dangerous. Acting like they intend or wish to commit suicide
Frontal Assault	Noun	To attack from the front. Take the enemy head on.
Repulsed	Verb	to repel an attacking military force
Casualties	Noun	a member of the armed forces who is killed or injured during combat
